Ever wonder what a Liturgical Wheel Calendar is? Each spoke in the calendar represents a week. Weeks begin on the Lord's Day, Sunday, (the outer rim of the wheel.) and end on Saturday (the inner hub). Liturgical times are shown, as well as the Sacred Paschal Triduum, and Ordinary time.

The Year of Grace 2025



Christian Hospitality

This year's calendar is inspired by the theme of Christian hospitality, which is much more than a pleasure of welcome or greeting. It is receiving others as they are, as Christ would receive them. What we recognize that all people are children of God, we respond to each person we meet with love, openness, and a genuine desire to serve them as Jesus has modeled for us in the Gospels.

In the upper left, a parish openly welcomes all members of the Church community, meet, two children showing how they are hospitable to the earth and God's creation are seen in the upper right. Then, in the lower right, a picture of outdoor fun demonstrates that we are all one in Christ, and finally, the welcoming of strangers who are vulnerable and in need of care is portrayed in the lower left. In each depiction, a comforting glow of warmth and light reminds us that hospitality draws us out of the darkness and into the welcoming

radiance of Jesus. Hospitality is one way that we allow the Light of the World to shine within and through us. When we demonstrate Christian hospitality, the Light shines brightly, and we all share in the gift that is Jesus.

The center scene is a depiction of Jesus washing the feet of his disciples. In washing their feet, Jesus teaches his disciples that just as he serves them, they are obliged to serve others with the same humility (John 13). Subsequent to this Gospel scene, Jesus gives his disciples a mandatum, Latin for "commandment" (John 13:34-35). Jesus loved others and welcomed all into his presence. This is what Christian hospitality means—to love and serve others. It is within the walls of our local parish church that we can first identify ourselves as part of a larger community of faith, where our talents and gifts are valued and essential to creating a welcoming community (Matthew 18:20). Hospitality is not limited to the people of God; it extends to caring for all of God's creation, including natural resources, the plants and animals—every part of the earth we call home. In both Laudato si and Laudate Deum, Pope Francis tells us that creation is a holy and precious gift from God that we should nurture and care for. We are reminded that when we are truly hospitable to God's creation, when we welcome all people into our lives no matter our differences, we acknowledge each other as children of God. If we recognize that we are all brothers and sisters in Christ, we acknowledge the love of God that is present within all of us. We become aware of the profound unity that exists among all those who are baptized. When we are open and attentive to others in hospitality, we are willing to listen to others and their experiences and to be open to new understandings and possibilities for enrichment (Galatians 3:28). Hospitality was essential to life in ancient times (Hebrews 13:2), and today we are called to greet, welcome, and care for others as if they were angels or Jesus knocking on our door. The lower left scene on our calendar shows how Christians might receive unsuspected guests who are the poor, marginalized, and displaced persons: welcome them warmly, invite them in, and provide all that they may need.
