





## From the desk of Fr. Jeff:

## The next challenge for St. Patrick:

Every parish like every class has its own unique flavor. St. Patrick has a unique role or flavor in the history of the diocese. And it is true that as it has developed over the years which I have witnessed, it has contributed to the diocese as a whole. This is not solely about the DPAA but evidence can be found in our support of it. During each stage of our growth, we have been able to better support diocesan ministries.

But there is a much bigger picture here. It has gone unnoticed. The point is that the parish community has a unique role not only in diocesan history but in salvation history. The parish community is here for a reason. You and I are here for a reason in this parish community. The parish is a gift from Christ through the Church. We are part of the mission here and now. As we develop the gift, it has a greater influence in the area God has asked us to take care of.

The mission is to hear and spread the Good News of the Father's Love in Christ and to share it in this small rural area and reach literally thousands of sheep that have not met the Divine and Human Shepherd "who was tempted in every way we are though never sinned so that we can turn to Him for grace and mercy."

We are talking about offering people the God News of what only God can do for us and with us for this local people in Taylor Mill, Covington, Latonia and Independence (we are in all four cities some how:) So what is the challenge? Have we heard the Good News so deeply that we (not just the priest and a few parishioners) but every one here is willing to share it with another person who does not know the Love of God. The growth in the pews and the parish will only be able to continue to affect Salvation History to the extent we accept the challenge to share the Good News and to do what we need to do to experience first ourselves.

In 2003, following the terrible events and recovery from 911 in 2001 in our country, we began plans to renovate (much more involved than simply restoring an old church) and build a strong foundation, a strong center: The Center of it all, the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus to keep us centered in His Loving Embrace in our daily lives. The renovation marked more than an external feat. It was truly a miracle in light of what was happening in the world and church at that time. The people here became a light of hope and faith in a dark time and that has not ceased.

## The next challenge for St. Patrick: (continued from previous page)

We wanted to prune activities which take away from the forming and healing of the family. As the family goes, so does society. In other words, we focused on growing a healing and reconciling atmosphere rather than simply more extra curricula activities which take away from family time together and time with the Lord. Did you ever hear: "I am too busy"? We did not want to add to that busy-ness but find a way to help resolve it: To help the family find that inner Center who is Jesus and HIs peace and hope which only God can give in the midst of distracted and polarized society around us. Our Adoration Chapel open 24 hours a day has done that for so many of us, even if just for a few moments a day or week.

The challenge is to be a family of families as St Patrick Parish who can reach out and bring the Good News to others. We have begun to do that through the gracious parishioners facilitating bible studies, works of Mercy (Received Ministry) and also the expansion of our mission school (grade school) as a means of sharing the Good News.

Once again the challenge: Have you and I been so convicted of God's immeasurable Mercy and heart -changing (world changing graces) that we want to bring others (feeling lost, anxious, afraid, unreconciled, burdened) into the salvific encounter with Jesus Christ. Do we surrender to His Love to let it guide us in everything we do?


It is quite a challenge. Parish community is fragile. Artificial Intelligence will be the next revolution which will amply podcasts, videos, virtual reality. And so will people, especially the youth and young adults, find a place outside the parish community on the internet without the very personal encounter with each other and Christ around the Eucharistic table? There are and will be many good things that come with artificial intelligence, but will it replace relational and moral intelligence? All the more reason to share the Good News and experience it ourself in this place and this time. Are you and I are willing to do that here in our unique role and mission as St. Patrick community to contribute to Salvation History: the Good News of God who is Relationship (a Communion of Persons, One Trinitarian God).


Let's bloom where we are planted. And continue to bloom. These are the challenges of the New Evangelization and New Springtime.
