





Saints Louis and Zelie Martin

Saints Louis and Zelie Martin are the first married couple to be canonized saints together by the Catholic Church. Louis and Zelie each sought to join religious orders, but were prevented from realizing these dreams. Instead, Louis became a watchmaker and Zelie, a successful lace maker.

The two of them first met by chance one evening as they passed each other on a bridge in Alencon, France. On seeing Louis, Zelie heard an interior voice say to her, "This is he whom I have prepared for you." They courted just three months before being married on July 12, 1858.

For the first ten months of their marriage they chose to imitate Mary and Joseph and were celibate, but Zelie's confessor encouraged her that God wanted them to raise up many children for Him. She gave birth to a total of nine children, but four of them died very young. Zelie suffered depression as a result of the loss of her precious children, but she put her faith in God that they would be reunited in heaven someday.

Louis eventually quit making watches and helped Zelie manage their lace making business out of their home. They employed fifteen local women which they treated like members of their own family. The Martins prioritized faith and family in their every day lives, practicing Catholicism with great piety and reverence. They attended daily Mass, faithfully received Holy Communion on First Fridays, had daily family prayer and reached out to those in need. No matter how busy the lace making business made them, the Martins refused to work on Sundays. Louis and Zelie went out of their way to ensure that sick persons received the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick and that dying persons received Last Rites, which includes confession and Viaticum, a dying person's last Holy Communion.

Sadly, when their youngest daughter, Therese, was only four years old, Zelie died of breast cancer. Brokenhearted at their loss, Louis and his five daughters moved to Liseaux, France so they could be closer to family and the much needed help in raising the girls. One by one, the Martin girls joined religious orders. Despite his loneliness, Louis said, "It is a great honor for me that the Good Lord desires to take all of my children, if I had anything better, I would not hesitate to offer it to him."

The youngest of Louis and Zelie's daughters is the great saint we all know as The Little Flower, Saint Therese of Liseaux. At the age of 15, St. Therese would be joining the Carmelite order, Louis joyfully exclaimed, "Let us go before the Blessed Sacrament and thank God for all the graces He has granted us, and the honor He has paid me in choosing His Spouses from my household."

In 1891, St. Louis Martin suffered a couple of strokes causing partial paralysis and dementia. He spent three years in a mental hospital before being sent home to die at the age of 71. Saints Louis and Zelie Martin lived an ordinary life in which they prioritized God and family. Despite their many sufferings, they remained firm in their faith and became great models for all married couples. God's faithfulness to Louis and Zelie made it possible for their five daughters to join religious orders. Therese, is one of our most well known saints and a Doctor of the Church. Her sister, Leonie Martin, is also a candidate for sainthood.

In 1971, Pope Pius VI decided to do something unique in the Church and united the causes for sainthood of Louis and Zelie Martin. In 2015, Pope Francis canonized Saints Louis and Zelie Martin, the first married couple to be canonized together. Their Feast Day is celebrated on July 12th, the date of their wedding.

Saints Louis and Zelie Martin, patrons of illness, marriage, parenting and widowers, pray for us!

Pontifical Good Friday Collection– Pope Francis has asked us to support this collection which helps Christians in the Holy Land, where they are now less than 2% of the population.


