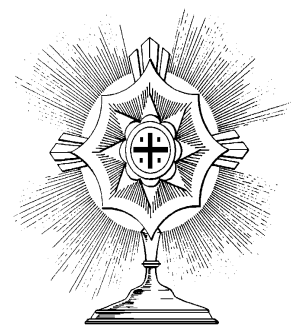

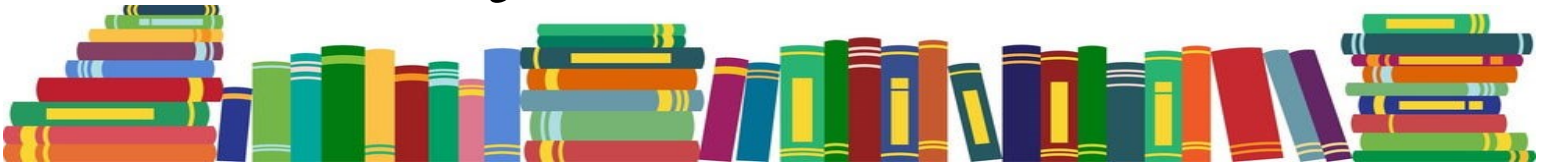

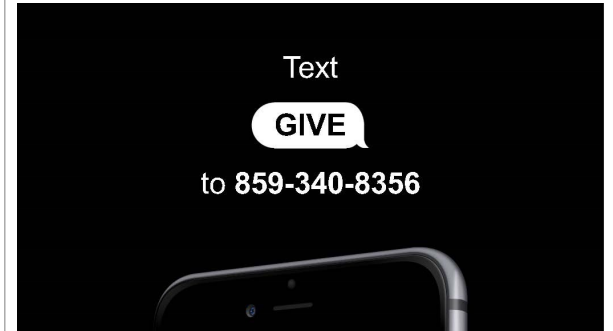

From the desk of Father Jeff **FEASIBILITY STUDY** (Expanding our Mission of Evangelization) *"Neither be conformed to this world; but be transformed [metamorphous] by the renewal of your discernment and mind" (Romans 12:1-2)*

Forming **our children in the beauty of the Gospel of Jesus, Word made flesh, is the root of evangelizing**. In the challenging times in which we live, we are all called to provide a safe and Christ-centered environment where the foundation of faith and reason will educate our children for generations to come. As previous generations who came from the Old St. Patrick in Covington and with a handful of parishioners assigned from St. Cecilia, Holy Cross and St. Anthony, they came with a vision of evangelization and mission of Mercy in this rural area. These are our founding grand fathers and grandmothers. They began to answer the call to provide the buildings and infrastructure that we use today. Many of them are now deceased and would love nothing more for us to complete what they began with Fr. Eviston. I am asking the parish to continue the dream and to answer today's call to expand the growing school that our St. Patrick's family began not too long ago.

The next step in our educational mission is to expand the school to include K through eighth grades and CCD. To do this, we will **add five classrooms and an Innovation room** to accommodate up to 225 students. Also, we hope to grow our existing foundation to provide tuition assistance where need exists. The junior high will also provide a feeder school to HCHS and more space for high school/young adult evangelization.

An important first step in preparing to expand our parish mission is our **feasibility study**. The study will help us gain valuable insight from our parish family regarding our plans, programs, facilities, and financial resources. Your insight and advice regarding this are essential. We are working with Scott Lubansky of Professional FundRaising Counsel (PFC). Scott helped us with our last campaign 20 years ago and he continues to help many regional churches and schools.

Interviews are being conducted from April 15th-May 3rd. You can participate in our study by contacting Christy Cool at the parish office (859) 322-0884 or (859) 356-5151 and she will schedule your interview with Scott. The interview is confidential and will take 30-45 minutes. It is important to note this interview is not a solicitation for funds at this time.

New Evangelization and St. Pat's missionary school in a rural area:

Now that we have made some progress on our parish and parish mission school over the years with gratitude to all of you, The question will arise: How many kids do you have in your rural parish and school?

Well it reminds me of another story. There was a man, a priest in fact, who started a school. He was asked how many he had in his school. He said 11. He was honest and continued. "Well, there were 12 but we lost one ." Of course, the priest, the Good Shepherd was Jesus. So the first Catholic school started with only 11.

And if someone asked Jesus how many did he have in his school, he had another answer. Evangelization. Each of the 11 talked to one more (double) and each of them then talked to one more (triple)etc. We now have a universal school of disciples.

If some one asks how many do you have in your rural school mission? The answer is how many unbaptized children and families or unchurched people do you or I know locally In our rural area (basically southern Kenton County and along RT536) ? The answer is simply: Have you and I experienced God's love and grace enough to want others to know it as well and invite (not force) them into our mission ? All of the sudden, it is not a numbers game.

It is all about wanting someone else to share His New Life. It is a new motivation.

Jesus said: " I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice"

It is true. The rural mission here is much more challenging than other areas . The good news is Jesus has people in the rural areas too whom he wants to reach . He says: "I must bring them as well. "

How many do you have ? **AS many as Jesus calls us to evangelize.**

You are the healer of my soul.

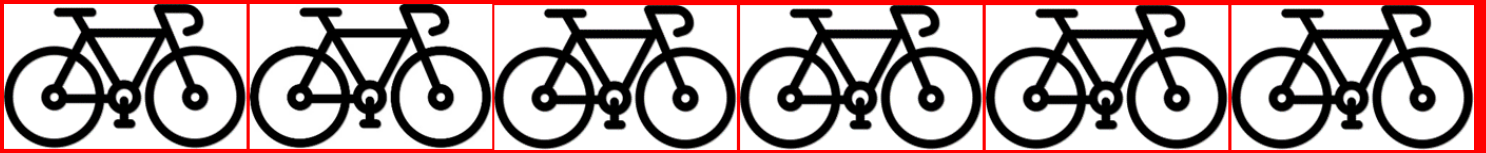
Take the blindness from my eyes, the deafness from my ears, the darkness from my mind, and the hardness from my heart.

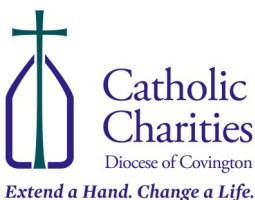
