Monday's Meeting

After discussion, we decided to wait until later in November to close the garden. There are cold crops that are doing well in both the ground and raised beds. Joyce and Joan offered to research the best cover crop to plant that will add nutrients to the soil.

Amanda has high school age sons who will work for Community Service Hours. I will look into St. Patrick's process of awarding service hours.

Communication:

- Interactive Calendar to track day to day activity in the patch.

- Setting up a BLOG page.

(I will work with Dianora and someone in the office to get up and running.)

Goals For Next Season:

- Volunteers decide which seeds you wish to start at home. (ie. spinach for me).

- St. Patrick's will follow the guidelines put out by the Kenton County Cooperative Extension. The Co-Op adheres to the University of Ky. "Follow the Science".

- Best time to plant: Crop Rotation: Companion Planting: Pest Control:

- Soil Sampling & recommendations:

- Composting for richer soil = better crops. We are accepting crushed organic eggshells and used coffee grounds. I will place a bin outside the garden, next to the compost bins. We will work the compost weekly, weather permitting.

Lessons learned:

- You're never too young or too old to learn and make a difference in gardens.

- * Bush beans and Spinach will go into raised beds.

- * Pest Control Science: Using insect science to prevent invasions. ie. lady bugs.

- * Kindness, Peace, Laughter and Joy are contagious, let's harvest that!!!

- * Thanks to Father Jeff for the opportunity for us to become disciples in the garden of life!

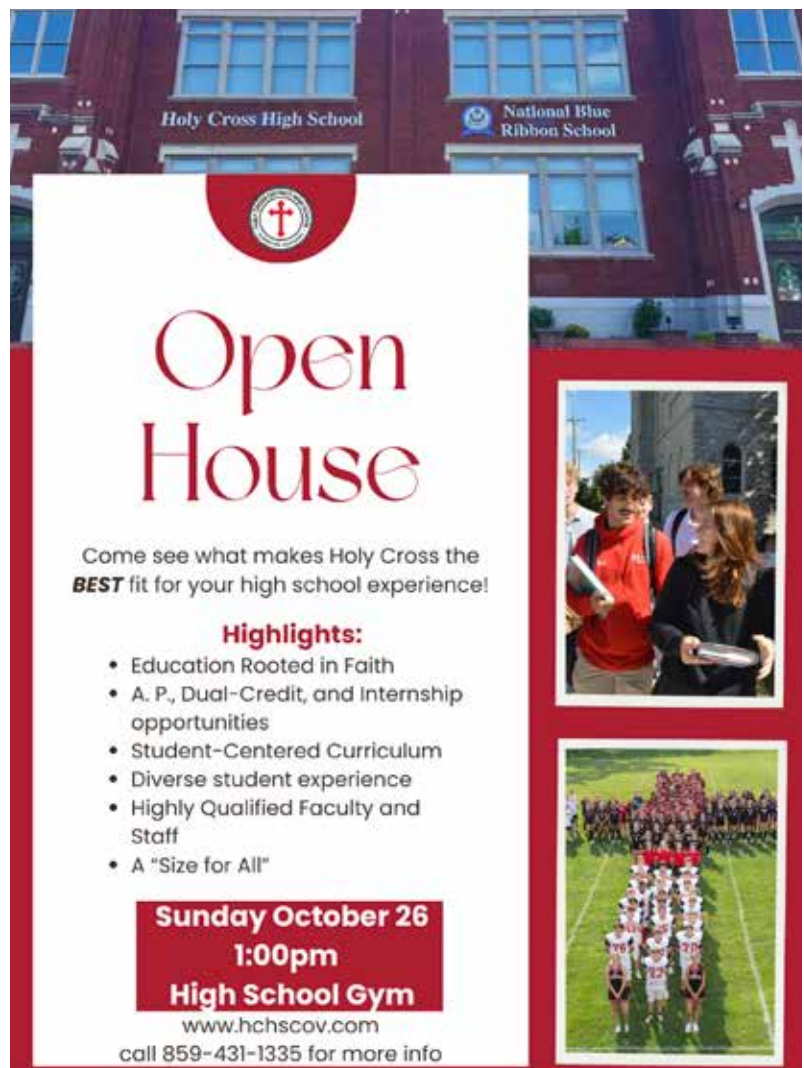
