THE NEW EVANGELIZATION

The new evangelization depends largely on the Domestic Church (cf. [Familiaris Consortio], n. 65). In our time... the eclipse of God, the spread of ideologies contrary to the family and the degradation of sexual ethics are connected. And just as the eclipse of God and the crisis of the family are linked, so the new evangelization is inseparable from the Christian family. The family is indeed the way of the Church because it is the "human space" of our encounter with Christ.²

"The family is also the primary place for evangelization, for passing on the faith, for helping young people to appreciate the importance of religious practice and Sunday observance.

EVANGELIZATION BENEFITS ALL AND GIVES

GLORY TO GOD

Small acts of love as well as larger acts are all considered evangelization to others when they witness this. We hope to highlight weekly, some of these evangelistic moments that parishioners at St. Pat's have experienced.

“The way my discipleship has been being worked out in my vocation as a mom to adult children and grandmother to my grandchildren is evangelizing through example. My children and their spouses know that my faith is very important to me. I give the "gift of time" to my grandchildren by spending time with each of them. When I'm with them we talk, read and sing about God, Jesus and Mary. They know that they are a blessing and a gift to our family. Currently I'm nurturing my faith by participating in Walking with Purpose bible study, and am in a prayer group. Something I'm adding to my evangelization efforts is visiting family members who are "shut ins" and their caregivers. Also, dropping by a nursing home to visit a friend's mother. I want to be present and let them know they're not alone in this later stage of their lives. They are seen and known by God and those who love them. I'm aware that I need to exercise the sacraments to be able to sustain any evangelization efforts I may have.

“I

see myself as an evangelical through my actions. I am a daughter, wife, mother and teacher. For example, I started my teaching career at a private Catholic School. Evangelical work is "easy" when you are with like minded believers. However, now that I teach at a public school, I have diverse people around me. I also, in my commission as a public school teacher, cannot "teach" my faith as before. I now teach through my actions and my behaviors; I do not have a formal religion class and cannot directly quote The Gospels. I can "live" the teachings of Christ through my daily life. When trying to follow Christ's examples in the Gospels, I came to a realization that He didn't teach and bring people to the Lord by quoting scripture and doctrine only. He brought people to the Lord by His actions: His compassion, kindness, care, and love are shown time and time again by how He interacted with people. That's is what I strive for - to be more Christ-like by how I show the Light of Christ in my heart as I embrace each interaction with people. How can I as a believer of The Gospels and The Eucharist show the Saving Light of Christ with what I say (or don't say) and what I do (or don't do)? Every human interaction is an opportunity to show Christ's love and evangelize."

“I

don't honestly set out to evangelize though when I think about it, I feel that I actually do it often in my daily life. When I have a chance, I help others. For example, I've paid for people in lines at the grocery and drug store when they didn't have enough money. I try to never let them know that I was the one that paid. I stop to help people broken down on the side of the road and I keep jumper cables in my car to assist people with their dead batteries. I try to do a lot of things like that."

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

January 18, 2026

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time


John 1:29-34

It's common to hear belief in Jesus and the Church mocked as blind faith and credulity. But in reality, it is deeply human and rational. Think about it: we rely on the testimony of others constantly. I trust chemists who certify the safety of toothpaste and cleaning products. I trust engineers when I use a microwave or drive over a bridge. Why? Because they have studied and seen what I have not, and their testimony proves itself in daily life. That kind of trust is not irrational; it is how human knowledge works.

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist declares: "Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God" (John 1:34). That is the language of an eyewitness. It invites us into a very human act: trusting someone who has directly encountered something — or Someone — we have not yet fully seen ourselves. The Church's faith is built on this kind of reliable sight-based testimony. The Apostles did not make abstract claims. They saw, followed, suffered for, and proclaimed Jesus Christ. Over centuries, their witness — carried in Scripture, in the lives of the saints, and in the sacramental life of the Church — has proven dependable. We come to know its truth by assenting to it, by living and studying it, praying with it, trusting it.

Faith in Christ is not a childish leap into the dark. It is a step into the light of testimony that proves itself over time.
