THE NEW EVANGELIZATION

The new evangelization depends largely on the Domestic Church (cf. [Familiaris Consortio], n. 65). In our time... the eclipse of God, the spread of ideologies contrary to the family and the degradation of sexual ethics are connected. And just as the eclipse of God and the crisis of the family are linked, so the new evangelization is inseparable from the Christian family. The family is indeed the way of the Church because it is the "human space" of our encounter with Christ.²

"The family is also the primary place for evangelization, for passing on the faith, for helping young people to appreciate the importance of religious practice and Sunday observance.

EVANGELIZATION BENEFITS ALL AND GIVES

GLORY TO GOD

Small acts of love as well as larger acts are all considered evangelization to others when they witness this. We hope to highlight weekly, some of these evangelistic moments that parishioners at St. Pat's have experienced.

The actual quotes used in the bulletin have been summarized.

“All of these areas, vocation, marriage, family, and parish provide me with the opportunity to become a better disciple of Christ and a force for evangelization. I am fortunate that these places are all filled with people who share my Catholic faith. So how do I see myself, well short of the goal. I see myself as I see all of the other people in these places. As a child of God who has choices to make each and every time I interact with others. Will I choose to show them Christ's love and will I receive their example of Christ's love? I see myself as extremely blessed and try to use these places as a standard for how I show the rest of the world Christ. I fall short far too many times, but I don't ever plan to stop trying.”

In my conversations I try to be in the moment- nothing more important matters than the person in front of me. Before our conversation ends, be it a niece, nephew, grandchild, friend or stranger, God is given the glory. I recently found a quote from Carlo Acutis, “Sadness is looking at ourselves, happiness is looking towards God.”

I pray for my family, friends and neighbors and for those who have no one to pray for them. As a caregiver for my husband I cannot get out to volunteer or physically help others. My faith is very important to me and my family knows this. I hope through prayer I am evangelizing and bringing Jesus to others.”

“M

My self-image isn't aligned with being an evangelist. The only thing I know how to do is express love through kindness, thoughtfulness, and listening. I do my best to see each person as a creation of God and treat them accordingly. When judgments do arise, I acknowledge my own weaknesses and then let go of condemnation and/or guilt. Between work and living, I have many opportunities to practice the above. Sometimes I do. Sometimes I don't. Forgiveness is the crux, I think, to expressing the love of God and drawing others closer to Him. My personal philosophy: Rest. Trust. Pray. Let Go and move on.”

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

January 25, 2026, 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 4:12-23


I was 22 years old, lying in bed one night while on a pilgrimage, when I suddenly sensed an idea in my mind: “Go to the seminary.” There was no voice, no vision, but a gentle and unmistakable clarity. I simply prayed, “Lord, if that’s from you, let me find great joy in it.” Three days later, my heart was bursting with joy. I dropped everything and entered the seminary. The older I get, the stranger my rather careless and hasty departure seems to me. I followed not because it made sense, or because I was especially brave. I went because the Lord called me.

Something like this happens in today’s Gospel. Jesus walks by Simon, Andrew, James, and John and says, **“Come after me” (Matthew 4:19)**. And *immediately* they leave their nets and follow. There’s no explanation, no hesitation … just movement. Why? As St. John says, **“In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us” (1 John 4:10)**. They do not leave their nets because his call made perfect, calculable sense. They left them because they were called. And Jesus’ call is powerful.

Take a moment this week to remember when Christ first called you. However small or quiet it was, recall it, and give thanks. The more we marvel that Christ has called us personally, the more passionately and freely we will follow him.— *Father John Muir*

HOLY CROSS HIGH SCHOOL LAUNCHES RIVER CITIES SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Holy Cross District High School has launched the River Cities Scholars Program, a new educational initiative supported by a \$2 million challenge grant from the Butler Foundation. The program is designed to expand access to Catholic education for students from Northern Kentucky's river cities while strengthening enrollment and community impact.

Through the challenge grant, Holy Cross will raise another \$2 million in matching funds and anticipates increasing enrollment in grades 9-12 by at least 50 students from Covington, Ludlow, Newport, Bellevue and Dayton, Kentucky over the next four years.

The River Cities Scholars Program will provide significant tuition assistance and academic opportunity to eligible students who reside in one of the five river cities and demonstrate financial need, desire to achieve, academic promise, leadership potential, and commitment to personal growth and community service. Selected students will receive coverage for up to two-thirds of their tuition for four years. Scholars may also apply for additional Holy Cross scholarships and will benefit from a comprehensive support system focused on academic excellence, leadership development and character formation.

The River Cities Scholars Program will begin in the 2026-27 academic year and reflects Holy Cross High School's mission to educate the whole person - mind, body and spirit - while investing in the long-term vitality of the region.

Holy Cross invites alumni, community members and philanthropic partners to support the River Cities Scholars Program. Contributions designated to the initiative will advance the school toward its \$2 million matching goal and help ensure the program's long-term success.
