**“DEAD SERIOUS...ABOUT LIFE”**





## THE TRANSFIGURATION: DIVINE LIGHT AND HOLY DARKNESS

Today's Gospel of Matthew presents Jesus' "transfiguration." For one brief moment, it is as if the curtain of Jesus' humanity is pulled aside, revealing his fully divine status.

In Scripture, God reveals himself on mountaintops. In the Old Testament, God gave Moses the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai. In the New Testament, Jesus gave us the Beatitudes after "going up a hill." Jesus died on the hill of Calvary. With the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor, we have the revelation of Jesus' divinity that shone through him as a blinding light for Peter, James, and John to behold.

The image the Gospels use to convey the Transfiguration is light. Jesus' face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. This is fitting, for light reveals what is already there. Jesus was always divine, yet people could not always see his divinity. On the top of Mount Tabor, it became clear to Peter, James, and John who Jesus truly is: "God from God" and "Light from Light," as we recite in the Nicene Creed. This light shone from his humanity and concrete existence. God's light shone through him, not apart from him. God's grace and light shine through our humanity, making it radiant in transfiguration. Our faith in Christ is not an obstacle to living a fully human life; it is the source of living a fully human life.

Lent begins in the desert. Last Sunday, we heard of Jesus' temptation — His hunger, His confrontation with evil.

Lent begins the season by reminding us of spiritual struggle. We enter forty days of prayer, fasting, and repentance, aware of our weakness and our need for grace.

Then, without delay, this Sunday lifts us up a mountain. Why this sudden burst of glory in the middle of a penitential season? Because Lent is not merely about sacrifice. It is about transformation.

In Matthew's Gospel, the Transfiguration follows immediately after Jesus predicts His Passion. The Cross is approaching. Suffering will not be avoided. Before descending the mountain toward Jerusalem, however, the disciples are granted a glimpse of who Jesus truly is. They see His divine glory — not as spectacle, but as preparation for His Passion.

We are given this vision at the beginning of Lent so that we do not lose heart on the journey. The light of the Transfiguration does not remove the Cross; it strengthens us to carry it. The glory revealed on the mountain is the same glory that will be hidden in suffering. Lent teaches us to trust that God's radiant presence can dwell even in the midst of weakness, uncertainty, or loss.

In the midst of this comes the darkness of the cloud. Scripture often associates the cloud with God's presence — guiding Israel through the wilderness, filling the temple, overshadowing holy moments. The cloud both reveals and conceals. It is luminous, yet it obscures. This is what might be called "Holy Darkness."

In the Lenten season, we may not see clearly where God is leading us. Prayer may feel quiet. Fasting may feel ordinary. Our spiritual efforts may not produce dramatic results. Yet the Transfiguration reminds us that God often draws closest within mystery. Divine light can be encountered in moments that feel apart from us. At the heart of it all is the Father's simple command: "Listen to him." Not simply to try harder. Not only to give something up. But to listen more attentively to Christ in Scripture, in prayer, in silence, and in the quiet movements of our conscience.

The Transfiguration is also a glimpse of Easter. The dazzling brightness points forward to Resurrection morning. Scripture shows us the destination early in the journey so that we will persevere through the climb. We begin Lent in the desert. We are strengthened by light on the mountain. We walk toward the Cross. And we move steadily toward the dawn of Easter.

The Transfiguration stands on the Second Sunday of Lent to remind us that the path of repentance is also the path of glory — and that beyond every holy darkness, divine light awaits.
