Mark *Altar Society Easter Flower* on the envelope and drop in collection basket. For your name to be listed in the bulletin the deadline is March 29th.



LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18-59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal. Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

BISHOP IFFERT INVITES ALL

The Most Reverend John C. Iffert, Bishop of Covington, invites all the faithful of the diocese: priests, deacons, consecrated religious, and laity, to join him for the Chrism Mass on Tuesday, March 31, 2026 at 7:00pm, at the Cathedral Basilica of the Assumption. The Sacrament of Penance will be available prior to Holy Mass, beginning at 6:00pm.

EXPLANATION OF CHRISM MASS

The Chrism Mass is a major Holy Week liturgy, where the bishop blesses three holy oils—Chrism, the Sick, and Catechumens—used in sacraments throughout the year. It symbolizes diocesan unity, with priests renewing their ordination vows before the bishop.

Purpose: To bless the oils used for Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders, and Anointing of the Sick.

Significance: It highlights the unity of the priests with their bishop and the unity of the entire diocese.

Ritual: Priests from across the diocese gather to renew their promises.

The Oils:

Oil of Chrism: Consecrated and used for sealing with the Holy Spirit.

Oil of Catechumens: Used for preparation for Baptism.

Oil of the Sick: Used for healing.

The oils are taken back to parishes to be used for the next year's sacramental life.
