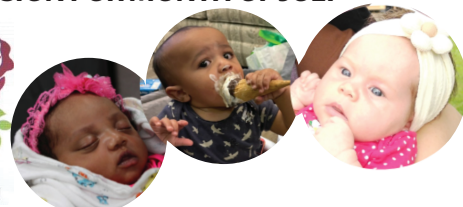

OUR LADY OF KNOCK PILGRIMAGE, FRIDAY AUGUST 14 - AUGUST 22

St. Patrick invites all the faithful to seek the intercession of Our Lady of Knock, the Blessed Virgin Mary to realize the love of Jesus and the peace and guidance of His mother Mary more deeply. Every



Please join us for Mass and Adoration for as many days as possible for a deep and inspirational prayer experience. Adoration of the Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament is also available 24 hours a day in the chapel.

August, parishioners and pilgrims come to St. Patrick Catholic Parish Shrine and School in Taylor Mill, Kentucky to seek the intercession of Our Lady of Knock, the Blessed Virgin Mary. "Lady of Knock" was so titled during an apparition in Knock, Ireland in 1879. "The Story of Knock began on the 21st of August 1879, when, at approximately 8 o'clock in the evening, fifteen people from the village of Knock in County Mayo, Ireland, witnessed an Apparition of Our Lady, St. Joseph, St. John the Evangelist, a Lamb and Cross on an altar at the gable wall of the Parish Church. The witnesses watched the apparition in the pouring rain for two hours, reciting the rosary. Although they themselves were saturated, not a single drop of rain fell on the gable or vision. Though not a word was spoken by Our Lady, St. Joseph and St. John during the silent apparition at Knock, the vision spoke louder than words with an eloquent message uniting earth and heaven. The fifteen official witnesses, most of whom were from the village of Knock and surrounding areas and ranged in age from 5 to 74 years old. Each of the witnesses gave testimonies to a Commission of Enquiry in October 1879. The findings of the Commission were that the testimonies were both trustworthy and satisfactory."

HOW ST. PAT'S CAME TO BE HER DESIGNATED SHRINE

In October 2007, Bishop Foys designated St. Patrick Church in Taylor Mill a Shrine to Our Lady of Knock. In May 2009, Knock Shrine in Ireland blessed St. Patrick Shrine with a piece of the gable wall where Mary appeared in 1879. In addition, the grotto behind St. Patrick's Adoration Chapel was blessed by the bishop where a statue of Our Lady was placed and dedicated, eyes directly on Christ.

(Notice the angels on the wall behind the altar, these are a replica of the actual angels in the church at the village of Knock in County Mayo, Ireland, sculpted by a talented parishioner here, at St. Pat's!)

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY**Question:**

I accept on faith that God is a Trinity of Persons, and I know it's something we can't fully understand. Should I just accept that, or should I try to learn more?

Answer:

There's a legend from the life of St. Augustine. As the early Church grappled with the identity of Christ and his relation to the other Persons in the Trinity, the holy theologian wrote a book about the Trinity. The story goes that, while he worked on the piece, he took a break to walk along the seashore. He came upon a small boy who had dug a hole in the sand. He was carrying a bucket, which he'd fill up with seawater and pour into the hole. Back and forth he walked. St. Augustine gently chided the young boy, "You can't pour the whole ocean into that hole." The boy responded, "And you cannot fit the whole Trinity into your mind."

The Trinity is a mystery! Our finite mind can't

comprehend the infinite God. Of course, the lesson isn't about giving up trying to understand God. St. Augustine did write that treatise, after all. The hunger to know more about God is good. We can read books about the Trinity or about the fatherly love of God, the life of Christ, and the movement of the Holy Spirit in our lives. More than that, we can deepen our life of prayer. The heart of our Trinitarian teaching is "God is love." The Three Persons are an infinite relation of love between one another. Real understanding of that comes less through our heads but through our hearts.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

*July 19, 2026, Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Matthew 13:24-43*

A man recently told me he was losing patience with the Church. "It's supposed to be God's Kingdom on earth," he said, "but it's full of contradictions and hypocrisy. Why can't the Church just be better?" That last word landed with a judgmental thud. It hurt. Because at times the Church can look painfully ordinary, even disappointing.

But Jesus' parables in today's Gospel meet that frustration head-on. He says, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field," yet the weeds grow up with the wheat, and the master allows both to grow together until harvest. To his listeners, this sounded strange, even offensive. They expected God's reign to be pure, powerful, and glorious, anything but mixed up, hidden, or small.

Jesus is showing us something essential. The Kingdom always begins small and grows amid imperfection. Grace and weakness exist side by side until the harvest. That is why the Church often looks messy. Yet within that mess, God's quiet work continues. The weeds do not stop the wheat from growing.

When we see the Church's flaws or our own, it helps to remember that this is exactly the field in which Christ chose to plant. The miracle is not that everything looks perfect, but that his Word keeps taking root anyway.

Lord, give me patience with Your field, the Church. Help me see Your hidden life growing even among the weeds. Amen.
