MONTH OF SEPTEMBER IN THE CHURCH

Exaltation of the Cross

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross commemorates the discovery of the True Cross, the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, and its recovery from the Persians. It signifies the triumph of Christ's cross over death, transforming a symbol of shame into a radiant banner of victory, salvation, and God's love. Lifting up our gaze should not enkindle fear, but gratitude, because that elevation is the measure of the love with which God loves His children, in His Son. It is the Mercy of God, therefore, which, as is the case with Nicodemus, illuminates the darkness of our lives and allows us to continue on our journey.

We cannot remain neutral regarding the Cross of Jesus. Either we are with Him or we are against Him. A choice is made before every action, for the actions of a Christian are none other than the testimony of how "God has loved us so much that he gave His only Son, Jesus".



Devotion to the Seven Sorrows of Mary

1st Sorrow: The Prophecy of Simeon
"And you yourself a sword will pierce" (Lk 2:35).

2nd Sorrow: The Flight into Egypt
"The angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him'" (Mt 2:13).

3rd Sorrow: Search for the Child in Jerusalem
"After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, 'Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety'" (Lk 2:46, 48).

4th Sorrow: Mary Meets Jesus on His Way to the Cross
"And carrying the cross himself." (Jn 19:17). "A large crowd of people followed Jesus, including many women who mourned and lamented him" (Lk 23:27).

5th Sorrow: Standing at the Foot of the Cross
Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, 'Woman, behold, your son.' Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold, your mother.' And from that hour the disciple took her into his home" (Jn 19:25-27).

6th Sorrow: The Crucifixion and Descent from the Cross
After this, Joseph of Arimathea, secretly a disciple of Jesus for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate if he could remove the body of Jesus. And Pilate permitted it. So he came and took his body" (Jn 19:38).

Seventh Sorrow: Assisting at the Burial of Christ
"The women who had come from Galilee with him followed behind, and when they had seen the tomb and

the way in which his body was laid in it, they returned and prepared spices and perfumed oils" (Lk 23:55, 56).

COMMENTARY ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

Matthew 18:21-35

In my parish, there was once a new employee who frequently told me she was sorry for various imperfections in her work. It could be a little tiring. I finally told her, "You know, you don't have to say 'sorry' so often." She looked me right in the eyes and said, "Father, you're right. I'm sorry." Her ear-to-ear grin betrayed that she enjoyed the irony — and that she would keep asking for forgiveness as often as she needed it.

The Gospel reading this week proclaims to us that God, in Jesus, delights in numerous requests for, and the granting of, forgiveness. To Peter's question, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus responds, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." In other words, Peter, stop counting.

Christian life should be marked by a commitment to frequent forgiveness. **God never tires of forgiving us.** His limitless love has overcome the power of vengeance, hatred, and division. We tap into that each and every time we ask for forgiveness or extend it to another.

How beautiful our hearts become when they become accustomed to frequent forgiveness! How joyful and attractive become our marriages, families, and parish communities! How light our souls feel when unburdened by the habit of keeping score.

Challenge: Name one thing, small or large, for which you could ask forgiveness from someone in your life. Then do it.

Then there are those that cannot admit sorrow or forgiveness:

To be able to admit that we've done something wrong requires a certain level of self-esteem or ego strength. People who are deeply insecure can find it challenging to say I'm sorry in part because a single mistake has the power to obliterate their self-worth. The idea that they could make a mistake and still be a valuable and good person is unthinkable for someone whose self-esteem is severely lacking. An apology is an admission of fallibility, which can trigger the vast reservoir of inadequacy and shame they carry, and thus threaten the fragile narrative they've constructed about themselves. For a person with a damaged sense of self-worth, acknowledging error can be tantamount to annihilation.

GRACE is God's free and unmerited love, help, and forgiveness given to people.

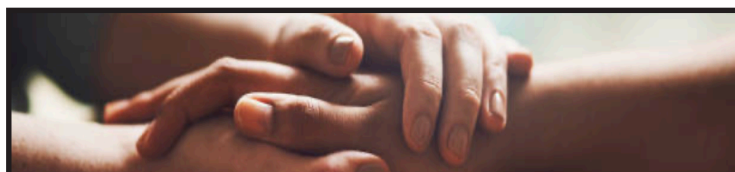
